Only applications that include all of the following documents will be evaluated by Faculty and Departmental Academic Advisors:

- 1. The summary of your online application. This link will be sent to you once you have been selected by your Home University;
- 2. The <u>study plan</u>* (*plan d'études, which includes course names and codes*) duly signed and dated by the student and the home university's Academic Advisor;
- 3. A letter of intent, <u>written in French</u>, with the academic objectives that the student wishes to achieve by participating in the exchange program;
- 4. A copy of the student's academic transcripts, which must include <u>all the courses taken to date</u> as well as the marks obtained during the last study year, and the grading system used by the home university. If transcripts are in a language other than French or English, please send the originals with a translation in one of the two languages;
- 5. The list of courses for which the student is currently registered at the home institution (with the name and a short description);
- 6. For students for whom French is not the first language, a French language proficiency certificate must be provided. This certificate must be delivered by an accredited institution (home university's Department of Languages, French Alliance, School of Languages, etc.);
- 7. A letter of recommendation from the home university's Academic Head, Advisor or other appropriate authority;
- 8. A copy of these two (2) official identification documents :
 - a. Passport;
 - b. Document listing names of the student and the student's parents (e.g. birth certificate or family record book).
- 9. Applicants to architecture, industrial design and interior design must also include a portfolio of their work with their application.

Deadlines for receipt of applications at the International Relations Office:

- Fall term (September to December): May 1st
- Winter term (January to April): September 1st
